Message from Greendale Schools Superintendent

Dear Community Members,

The Park & Recreation team has been taking action on the strategic priorities identified last year by building youth engagement opportunities for our students through a series of new after-school enrichment activities at the elementary level. These new activities include basketball, volleyball and soccer for students interested in athletics. Each school will also run Young Rembrandts, Coding, and Mad Science programs for students looking for a challenging academic enrichment activity. Elementary school families can learn more about these programs by clicking on the "Activities & Clubs" link on each school's website.

We are completing preliminary work with the Panther Community Facility Advisory Team to obtain feedback on proposed solutions to facility needs for our schools. As we create more opportunities for youth and adults to interact and engage in

our schools through Park & Recreation, we need to consider possible infrastructure improvements to effectively meet the demands and needs across our community. From community feedback, there appears to be support for improvements to safety and security as well as the need to create learning environments that are flexible and adaptable. The next step in assessing the facility improvements is to develop specific plans with anticipated costs to share with the community. Based on this information, community members will be invited to complete a survey in March that will give the District a sense of which of these proposed improvements are supported and the tax tolerance of our community members. We look forward to gathering your feedback and utilizing it to determine next steps for the proposed facility improvements.

Our Senior Social Club is excited by its move to a new, "old" location at St. Luke's Church in the Village. While the Hose Tower is a lovely facility, the space

at St. Luke's is more conducive to the needs of our older adults who participate in this group's programming.
